Thank you for your interest in our Child Life Practicum Program. We offer entry-level training three times a year through the Child Life, Education, and Creative Arts Therapy Department.

This training aims to introduce individuals to the child life field, highlighting the various experiences children and adolescents face in healthcare settings. Under the supervision of a Certified Child Life Specialist (CCLS), students will participate in individual and group activities with children and families.

Practicum Requirements:

Practicum students must have completed core coursework, including child development, and demonstrated successful experience working with children. This training is highly recommended for students considering a career as a child life specialist. Students must complete 30 hours per week over six weeks (Clinical days: Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Friday, and Education day: Thursday). To ensure broad exposure to the field, we recommend completing your practicum and internship at two different locations.

Application Deadlines:

- January Training: September 15th
- May/June Training: January 15th
- September Training: May 15th

Please note: The application deadline is a postmark deadline. All materials must be postmarked by the session deadline to be considered. We do not accept hand-delivered applications. While submitting an application does not guarantee acceptance, we prioritize providing quality supervision and education to each student. As a result, only a limited number of students are accepted each semester.

PRACTICUM JOB DESCRIPTION

The practicum student will gain extensive exposure to the child life profession through observation and supervised participation. This experience prepares the student for more intensive, career-oriented training in child life or a related field.

Program Components:

- Observe inpatient and/or outpatient child life/therapeutic recreation services.
- Enhance understanding of child development and the effects of healthcare experiences on children.
- Learn the value of play and appropriate play activities in the healthcare setting.
- Facilitate group and individual diversional and therapeutic activities.
- Observe medical play, psychological preparation, and procedural support to better understand the role of a child life specialist.
- Develop an understanding of the multifaceted role of the child life/therapeutic recreation professional.

Practicum Objectives:

Through observation, collaboration with child life staff, active participation in child life programming, and ongoing supervision and feedback, the practicum student will:

- Become familiar with the child life profession.
- Recognize reactions to stress, illness, and pain in children (infancy through adolescence) and their family members.
- Develop communication skills with children and families in the healthcare setting.
- Understand the importance of establishing and maintaining therapeutic relationships.
- Recognize the value of play and psychosocial support interventions.
- Integrate developmental knowledge with practical application.
- Set goals for learning based on self-evaluation.
- Complete assigned tasks in a timely and professional manner.

Program Prerequisites:

- Completion of the *junior year* of a bachelor's degree.
- A minimum of four college-level courses in relevant fields (e.g., family studies, child/human development, education).
- At least 100 hours of practical experience with children (infants through adolescents). Examples include babysitting, early childhood education, or similar roles.
- A minimum of 40 volunteer hours in a pediatric healthcare environment or a setting with children who have chronic illnesses.

Student Expectations:

- If your academic program or supervisor has specific practicum requirements, they will be adjusted accordingly.
- Minimum of four written goals for the practicum experience.
- Daily reflective journal of your experiences.
- Plan, implement, and evaluate therapeutic activity.
- Become familiar with medical terminology and complete associated assignments.
- Attend designated in-services and wrap-up sessions.
- Complete required readings (we utilized the ACLP pre-internship modules).
- Complete ACLP Pre-Internship Developmental Worksheets daily.
- Use the child life needs assessment form.
- Discuss chart note usage with each rotation supervisor.
- Option to participate in mock interviews and resume reviews.
- Complete self-evaluation and program experience evaluations.
