This is a two-year program with the first year accredited by the ACGME. The second year offers a graduated junior attending experience (no call or weekends) and clinical enhancement rotations (either at CHOP or external institutions) in areas of specific clinical interest to the candidate (i.e., vascular malformations, skull-base, etc.). Leadership and business of medicine training (i.e., Wharton Course, ACPE annual course, Zupko coding course) are also offered in the second year.
