• School Activities •

Asthma Classes

- A series of **FREE** asthma classes that teach children about asthma management. Topics include: All About Asthma, Triggers of Asthma and Prevention Techniques, Asthma Medicines, and Asthma Devices
- For students with asthma in grades 1 - 12
- Students receive free giveaways including tote bags, mattress covers, asthma devices and gift certificates.
- Can be scheduled during student lunch period or after school and adapted to meet your school's needs



Education for School Professionals



- School personnel receive **FREE** continuing education, which provides a basic understanding of asthma and its impact on attendance, school performance and learning of the school child.
- Certified school staff receive ACT 48 credit

- General awareness of asthma as a chronic disease that can be controlled
- Improved management of asthma in the schools
