I. ASSESSMENT

The **purpose** of the needs assessment is to **identify and prioritize community health needs** so that the Hospital can develop strategies and implementation plans that benefit the public as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable Care Act.

PURPOSE

This report summarizes the results of an assessment of the health status and unmet health care needs of residents of The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) area.

The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) is located in the University City area of Philadelphia, but serves children and their families throughout the five counties of Southeastern Pennsylvania, the State of New Jersey, and beyond.

- The purpose of the needs assessment is to identify and prioritize community health needs so that the hospital can develop strategies and implementation plans that benefit the public, as well as satisfy the requirements of the Affordable Care Act.
- The needs assessment was conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, a private non-profit public health institute.

COMMUNITY DEFINITION


The CHOP community (2015 Pop. 627,549) for purposes of this needs assessment was defined as **the contiguous Zip codes in the five counties of Southeastern Pennsylvania: Bucks; Chester; Delaware; Montgomery; and Philadelphia.**

The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, the oldest hospital in the United States dedicated exclusively to pediatrics, strives to be the world leader in the advancement of healthcare for children by integrating excellent patient care, innovative research and quality professional education into all of its programs.

CHOP's primary service area and community is a large geographic area with 1.45 million children including urban, suburban and rural populations. The service area includes zip codes of 14 counties in Southeastern Pennsylvania, Northern Delaware and Southern New Jersey. However, for purposes of this CHNA, the service area was defined as the five counties of Southeastern Pennsylvania: Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia.

CHOP is the only freestanding, independent (i.e. not affiliated with a health system) pediatric hospital in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, thus affording it an unparalleled singular focus on pediatric services. It is one of only three pediatric hospitals in its primary service area. (Map 1).

In 2013, CHOP conducted a community health needs assessment of its service area. The essential findings from that needs assessments are summarized below.

PREVIOUS NEEDS ASSESSMENT

In CHOP's first CHNA conducted in 2013, eight areas of focus where identified based on CHNA findings. Focus areas were based on need, resources committed by CHOP, and the Hospital's ability to improve health outcomes for a particular population in our community.

The eight areas of focus in 2013 were:

- 1) Access to primary care and health education;
- 2) Cultural and language barriers to access care;
- 3) Chronic disease management for asthma;
- 4) Overweight/obesity prevention and intervention;
- 5) Access to special programs for adolescents;
- 6) Access to behavioral and mental health services;
- 7) Navigating the complex health-care system; and
- 8) Access to dental, vision and specialty care for children.

In response to these focus areas, CHOP developed various strategies to address these needs. Significant progress has been made in CHOP's ability to positively influence these identified needs.

Priority 1: Access to primary care and health education; and Priority 2: Cultural and language barriers to access care Objective: Increase access to culturally sensitive and appropriate primary care

Progress: The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia opened the Nicholas and Athena Karabots Pediatric Care Center in West Philadelphia at 48th and Market Streets in January 2013. Since its opening in 2013, the Center has provided care to approximately 33,000 individual patients. This includes 9,400 new patients, only half of which were newborns, indicating that the other half either transferred care or were previously not receiving care. The services have been provided in over 180,000 well, sick, follow-up and nurse provider visits and have included administration of 182,500 vaccines. Seventy-five percent of patients are on a medical assistance plan and another 4% are covered under a CHIP Plan. Services provided specifically targeting lower-income households include Early Head Start, Reach Out and Read, the Refugee Health Program, and Community Asthma Prevention Program. Two added community partnerships also bring together organized grief counseling groups for children of all ages and their caregivers and behavioral health services. Nursing Care Coordination staff has been increased from one to three RNs, which contributed among many other services to the Karabots Center achieving a nationally recognized National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) Medical Home Certification at the highest level available during the most recent review period in 2014.

Housed at the Karabots center is CHOP's refugee clinic. Since 2011, the program has served over 300 newly-arrived refugee children. The average interval between arrival in the US and the first appointment is just 23 days, which is critical for catchup vaccination and school entry. Nearly all patients (98%) have had a follow up primary care visit, indicating that they have begun the process of integration into a medical home.

In the spring of 2016, CHOP opened The Community Health and Literacy Center, located in an economically and culturally diverse community in South Philadelphia. The Center is a LEED Silver green building, replacing a former 20,000 square foot building at this site with a 94,000 square foot, three-story building housing four fully integrated components: The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia Care Network, Primary Care, South Philadelphia; The City of Philadelphia's Health Center 2; The Free Library's South Philadelphia Neighborhood Library; and The DiSilvestro Recreation Center.

Within the facility, CHOP's new 22,500-square-foot space provides an additional 6,200 square feet compared to the previous location, and accommodates six additional exam rooms and a large waiting area with dedicated space for reading and computer use.

The City of Philadelphia's Health Center 2 treats nearly 50,000 patients annually, offering adult and pediatric care; women's healthcare, including gynecology, family planning, prenatal care, and dental care as well. The new 28,500-square-foot space includes additional exam rooms along with an additional dental operatory and state-of-the-art radiology and mammography services. Both of these new spaces are estimated to create a combined increase in new City and CHOP patient visits annually to 183,000, up from 168,000 in 2012.

The Free Library's space has been designed in recognition of the evolving way media is consumed and is functionally integrated into a site where thousands of children and families will visit for medical care and recreation. It is expected to serve 35,000 more patrons annually due to the increase in foot traffic as well as expanded programming and operations. The library has general seating arrayed along the Broad Street side as well as clusters of flexible seating and collections defining areas for different age groups and activities. Enclosed spaces include a dividable multi-purpose room and a combination computer lab and "maker space" for consumers to embark on creative activities.

The DiSilvestro Playground and Recreation Center has been renovated utilizing state-ofthe-art construction materials to create a soft, smooth surface on equipment and in play areas-carefully designed to ensure safety for children of all ages, sizes and capabilities. The playground will feature substantial green space and a rain garden. The recreation center will double in size, greatly expanding existing programming in both offerings and frequency, using the renovated outdoor space to offer story time in partnership with the library and other outdoor events such as community movie nights. The recreation center will be able to serve as many as 5,000 users, up from 1,000.

To address the need for primary care in suburban counties, CHOP opened a primary care site in Norristown, Montgomery County to respond to the need for pediatric services in 2013. This site has seen an increase in visits over the last three years resulting in the addition of a third physician in 2015. CHOP's Springfield office in Delaware County will move in mid-June 2016 to provide additional space for primary care services in this region of Southeastern Pennsylvania.

To address cultural and language barriers in the suburbs, CHOP's Language Services Department initiated a project to require our ambulatory locations serving a high volume of Spanish speaking people to be staffed with onsite medical interpreters starting in July 2013. This meets an identified need to improve cultural and language barriers for patients and their families, enabling them to receive proper care. In October of 2012, CHOP implemented the in-house Language Services program under the umbrella of the Patient and Family Services Department to allow limited English proficient (LEP) patients and families increased access to services and the ability to fully participate in their health care. The current interpreting team includes 13 Spanish interpreters, 14 Arabic interpreters, and 1 Cantonese/ Mandarin interpreter. Starting in February 2016, CHOP will offer an American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter. In total, CHOP Language Services provides interpreters for approximately 80 different languages per year with the assistance of 3 language services vendors. The volume of interpreting encounters has increased by 55% from 54,000 encounters in 2012 to 84,000 encounters in 2015, and is projected to exceed 100,000 encounters in 2016.

A number of initiatives are also underway at CHOP that are helping us build our cultural competency and meet the needs of all children in Philadelphia. Among them is our partnership with Puentes de Salud (Bridges of Health), a nonprofit organization that promotes the health and wellness of South Philadelphia's rapidly growing Latino immigrant population. Eighteen CHOP pediatric emergency medicine physicians, nurse practitioners and nurses began volunteering at Puentes de Salud in 2015, providing routine physical examinations and vaccinations. CHOP also supports Puentes de Salud's "Puentes Hacia el Futuro" program, which pairs elementary school children with tutors/mentors who are college students and community professionals.

In an effort to reach the most vulnerable children, the Homeless Health Initiative (HHI) has served as a volunteer outreach program coordinated by CHOP's Community Education Department. Volunteers provide medical and dental services to children in area shelters and assist families in accessing important health care services including health insurance, primary care and specialty care. Since 2013, HHI recently launched the Healthy Baby Project, a pilot program that includes a weekly nurse visit to a shelter to check on 0 to 4 month-old babies and provide support and education to new mothers. HHI's Healthy Infant nurse continues to provide health education workshops to mothers of infants in the HHI shelters.

A recent needs assessment conducted in Trenton, N.J. has resulted in the development and implementation of an ongoing health education workshop series operated by CHOP at HomeFront Preservation Center in Trenton.

Priority 3: Chronic disease management for asthma

Objective: To better diagnosis asthma and increase access to asthma care; To better manage asthma in children with more targeted health education for children and parents

Progress: CHOP implemented an electronically coordinated management system, MyChart and EpicCare, to be used in inpatient, emergency, and outpatient settings by clinical teams and families to monitor asthma control between doctor visits. The MyAsthma portal allows family members to enter information on treatment, symptoms and side effects from home, provides condition-specific educational content, provides tools to track progress and identify obstacles, and provides decision support based on medical evidence. The portal has been implemented at 12 primary care practices for approximately 300 families of children with asthma.

In addition, an asthma care plan is being developed in Epic (CHOP's electronic medical record) that will be more user friendly for both the provider and the patient/family. All providers across the continuum of care will now have access to the same Asthma Care Plan so that care will be consistent. Two committees meet regularly to discuss and plan CHOP's approach to the diagnosis of asthma for all patients in CHOP's network. Any parent/guardian using the MyAsthma portal has access to his/her child's current asthma care plan.

Asthma Navigators are also assigned to all CHOP primary care urban sites, including Karabots, South Philadelphia and Cobbs Creek, to meet families of children with highrisk asthma and coordinate asthma management. The Navigator completes a needs assessment and conducts home visits to provide asthma education and facilitate communication between the patient, physician, school nurse and other providers. Over the past year, the program enrolled 160 children in home visits and the asthma navigators have conducted over 200 visits. In addition, the asthma navigators provide in-office care coordination and asthma education for families as requested by their primary care provider. Over the past year they have had nearly 500 high-touch encounters with families to provide these services.

CHOP's Community Asthma Prevention Program (CAPP) also continues to implement programs for asthma education in the community, home asthma education and environmental mitigation in Philadelphia, school asthma education and primary care provider asthma education.

Priority 4: Overweight & obesity prevention and intervention Objective: Increase children and adolescents' access to healthy living education and healthy weight programs

Progress: CHOP' Healthy Weight Program, located in West Philadelphia, advances the prevention and treatment of childhood obesity by integrating excellence in clinical care, research, quality education, and community advocacy. The Healthy Weight Program is now augmenting the CHOP primary care experience with clinically relevant support to better identify and manage overweight and obese patients in the primary care setting. The goal of this work was to both increase early diagnosis of overweight and obese patients, and then to offer interventions within the primary care setting. Three resources were developed to address this need: a health educator professional who is housed in the primary care setting, a clinical pathway to guide practitioners in primary care in weight management, and a clinical decision support module and tool to assist providers in documenting in the electronic medical record (EMR). Through these implementations, primary care providers have been able to increase their day-today recognition and management of obesity in the medical home. It has also helped guide when a patient needs to be referred to the Healthy Weight Program. These processes and resources help to bridge the gap between the Healthy Weight specialty program and primary care.

CHOP has also implemented a screening process for patients and families at CHOP's three Philadelphia Primary Care Network sites to identify young children in food insecure households. Food insecurity (FI) defined as the lack of consistent access to enough food for an active, healthy life, is a growing public health problem in the United States and has been linked to parental report of poor health, higher hospitalization rates, and psychosocial and behavioral problems among children. A validated 2-item FI screen was trialed at the sites. Families with a positive screen are provided resources either to a CHOP social worker and/or the Benefits Data Trust, a community based organization, to assist the family in accessing benefits. The outcomes of this pilot are in the process of being evaluated.

Another program in the community which addresses overweight and obesity prevention and intervention include Home Plate. Parents enrolled in CHOP's Early Head Start Program have the opportunity to participate in Home Plate, a CHOP research study that entails participating in a six-week series of classes focused on improving cooking skills and nutrition. Home Plate works closely with West Philadelphia community partners, including Aramark, CHOP's Early Head Start, The Enterprise Center Community Development Corporation, and WIC.

In addition, CHOP's Homeless Health Initiative (HHI) provides Operation CHOICES, an evidence-based nutrition and fitness program, uniquely tailored for the shelter environment. Programs under the Operation CHOICES umbrella include: Safe Physical Activity and Recreation for Kids (SPARK) and Women's Wellness. SPARK is a weekly program teaching children about exercise and good nutrition through fun activities to help break the cycle of obesity in children experiencing homelessness. Women's Wellness is an educational program that combines nutrition and fitness for mothers living in shelters. In 2015, HHI provided nutrition and physical fitness activity sessions at three West Philadelphia shelters. There were 97 Women's Wellness sessions and 114 SPARK sessions, reaching a total of 1,860 participants. Over 120 HHI volunteers consisting of physicians, nurses, social workers and others facilitated these sessions.

Over the last three years, CHOP partnered with the Independence Blue Cross Foundation for the "Healthy Futures" program. CHOP nurses supported the "Stay Well" component of Healthy Futures by providing health and wellness screenings, referrals to relevant healthcare resources and education about healthy choices and healthy living. In year 2 of the Healthy Futures program, the CHOP School Nurse collaborated with expert trauma nurses to deliver trauma prevention education to over 500 students across the Philadelphia region. These students learned water, sun, bike, helmet, and pedestrian and playground safety. The CHOP school nurse also assisted school nurses in achieving 100% state mandated school screenings. In total, the Stay Well component of the program impacted 5,332 students in 135 encounters.

In the third and final year of the Healthy Futures program, the CHOP School Nurse collaborated with nurses from across CHOP to help educate all participating students in hand-only CPR. At just over the half way mark in the school year, the CHOP School Nurse has impacted 2,256 students in 88 encounters. This year, CHOP added the services of a nurse practitioner for completion of physical exams which is a state mandated requirement for all sixth-grade students. The nurse practitioner has completed over 30 physical exams. Exams are completed at the Global Leadership Academy with permission of the parent.

Priority 5: Access to special programs for adolescents Objectives: To encourage adolescents to get tested and treated for HIV and STIs; To increase education about teen pregnancy, HIV and STI prevention; and To help adolescents transition to adult care

Progress: "I KnowUShould2," a campaign created by CHOP in 2012, addresses the high rates of STI's among Philadelphia youth and continued its work to offer information, resources and support to youth seeking STI and HIV testing. I KnowUshould2 has collaborated with the Philadelphia Health Department and numerous other Philadelphia organizations to help increase testing and lower STI rates, and the 2014 data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) suggests these programs have been successful as the STI rates have started to decline among youth (13-24). I KnowUshould2 also collaborated with Philadelphia FIGHT to present Hip Hop for Philly, Philadelphia's largest youth HIV testing event, now entering its fourth year. In 2015 alone, I KnowUshould2 worked with 20 independent agencies to provide rapid HIV testing, STI testing and education to over 1,000 youth in Philadelphia, at over 11 Philadelphia Parks and Recreation Centers. The program also partnered with the Philadelphia Youth Network to provide education to over 800 of their student/summer employees at orientation. Also in 2015, I KnowUshould2 started a small youth community advisory board to help plan and implement Hip Hop for Philly. CHOP has expanded the programming to include other youth health and community related projects.

Part of adolescence is discovering and exploring sexuality. Patients at CHOP's Karabots Pediatric Care Center and Cobbs Creek Pediatric Care Center have access to "I Matter," a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) funded teen pregnancy prevention initiative that's a comprehensive, community-driven initiative focused on the reduction of teen pregnancy rates. The target population of this project has been the West and Southwest Philadelphia neighborhoods based on the previous community health needs assessment. The overall goal of the project is to reduce teen pregnancy rates by 10% over five years in the target population. Community awareness was an important component to increase the uptake of the most effective evidence based forms of contraception, including LARC (Long Acting Reversible Contraception) methods. Our goals were achieved through working with the community to provide clinical services and resources at multiple sites that serve at-risk and marginalized youth. The community was engaged through collaboration and education of its stakeholders and members about topics related to teen sexual and reproductive health. A key component of the initiative included the use of the evidence-based intervention "Be Proud Be Responsible." This curriculum brought together groups of teens for discussions about sexual health and contraception at the Karabots Pediatric Care Center, led by trained CHOP staff.

In an effort to expand our reach into the community, a CHOP health educator also works in the reproductive health resource centers at West Philadelphia High School and the Philadelphia Juvenile Justice Services Center. Risk reduction counseling and education occurs on site in these locations, and patients are referred to the Karabots Pediatric Care Center and CHOP Care Network Cobbs Creek primary care locations for expanded clinical care services, reproductive health care, and contraceptive counseling.

The Connect to Protect Project (C2P) of the Adolescent Trials Unit at CHOP is a research initiative to collaborate with community agencies to perform critical HIV primary prevention in community settings. The outcomes look at the current risk behaviors and changes in risk behaviors in youth in Philadelphia, as well as the ability to engage and mobilize the community to implement structural level changes that reduce barriers to prevention and care. To date, the C2P coalition consists of over 20 community partners and over 140 individuals assisting in structural change activities. Through data collection, strategic planning, and creating linkages, C2P addresses health promotion for young men, LGBTQ homelessness, and access to HIV and STI testing for youth.

Helping adolescents transition to adult services was another identified need. This is particularly needed for adolescents with special healthcare needs. CHOP's Rapport, Empowerment, Advocacy through Connections and Health (REACH) program holds four to six events per year for youth with chronic illness and/or disabilities to help prepare teens and young adults with special healthcare needs for a successful transition into adulthood. Each year, over 20 families benefit from REACH for College programming, and CHOP hosts events for families affected by Neurofibromatosis, Epilepsy, and Sickle Cell Disease. REACH has also developed materials available to the public on CHOP's website.

CHOP is also in the process of opening a center specific to the needs of young men needing transition support.

Priority 6: Access to behavioral and mental health services

Objective: To increase access to mental and behavioral health services for children and adolescents in the service area ensuring that children get the treatment they need for emotional, behavioral, substance abuse and mental health needs to curb the impact of violence on children and adolescents and advocate for societal change to keep our children safe.

Progress: The Department of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences has increased access to behavioral health services across CHOP, with a particular focus on our primary care practices, by expanding our Healthy Minds, Healthy Kids in two Care Network sites in two of CHOP's suburban locations and one location in the City of

Philadelphia. With a 50% increase of clinical staffing, there has been a significant reduction in wait times for appointments plus an expansion of services in the Hospital's Specialty Care Centers in PA and NJ. Other initiatives include spearheading events such as a recent town hall meeting that brought together representatives from 20 local agencies to discuss how to advance suicide prevention efforts in Philadelphia and the development of a medical behavioral inpatient unit, scheduled to open in 2017, for patients who are in the Hospital for a medical reason and need behavioral health care.

Additional services added since 2013 include an outpatient clinic targeting children and adolescents with substance use problems. The clinic offers outpatient treatment for adolescents who are between 16 and 18 years of age. Referrals can include patients who are enrolled in elementary, middle, or high school and have disclosed or tested positive for substance use and who may or may not have a co-morbid mental health condition.

CHOP's Children's Intensive Emotional and Behavioral Services (CIEBS), located in Atlantic County, N.J., provides two comprehensive partial hospital services in a behaviorally based, trauma-informed therapeutic setting for children between the ages of 5 and 13. In 2015, the CIEBS added an Extended Day Hospital Program to its treatment options. This program runs from 3:00-7:30 p.m. four days a week. This program option has increased access to high-quality psychiatric partial hospital services for children with severely challenging behavior struggles. CHOP also has a comprehensive

Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Behavioral Science Department providing emotional and behavioral health services for all children.

The Center for Fetal Diagnosis and Treatment at CHOP also initiated a mental health screening in 2012. To date, close to 2,000 expectant parents completed baseline assessment. Fifty-five percent of expectant mothers and 19% of expectant fathers demonstrated clinically significant risks for depression, anxiety or traumatic stress in direct response to receiving their fetal anomaly diagnosis. Fortunately, as a result of the support of psychological interventions and psychosocial support, when families receive a mental health screening one day after delivery while on the Special Delivery Unit, the rates for risk decreased (38% for mothers and 13% for fathers).

To address suicide prevention, the Youth Suicide Prevention in Primary Care Pennsylvania Model (YSP-PC) project is a multidimensional systems change approach focusing on suicide prevention in primary care for youth (ages 14 to 24). The creation of a screening tool has become a standard of care in CHOP's Emergency Department and was used for about 320 adolescents per month in 2015. In CHOP's primary care system, YSP-PC has screened 3,225 adolescents, identifying 366 youth at risk for suicide. When a screen is positive, the social worker is called after the provider discusses the positive screen. There is also a consent form allowing the Drexel Center for Family Intervention Science to follow-up with additional resources.

In response to needs assessment findings demonstrating the escalating violence affecting youth in CHOP's service area, particularly in Philadelphia County, CHOP's experts developed a community-based effort in 2013 to reduce exposure to and health effects of violence among youth. The Violence Prevention Initiative (VPI) conducts actionable research and implements innovative findings in hospitals and schools for maximum impact. VPI has established itself as the resource for violence prevention information and programming, both internal to the CHOP enterprise and in the local, regional and national communities. CHOP VPI aims to reduce and prevent peer bullying, aggression, peer violence, and intimate partner violence. It also incorporates current work being done to apply a resilience based, trauma-informed, and strengthbuilding model to address adverse childhood experiences.

CHOP also continues to explore tele-behavioral health services in an effort to reach patients living in rural communities and partnerships with the City of Philadelphia to provide mental health support in city schools.

Priority 7: Navigating the complex health care system

Objective: Continue to provide children and their families with assistance in navigating the health care system including finding them a primary source of care and determining insurance eligibility

Progress: Through the Family Health Coverage Program (FHCP), CHOP continues to provide assistance to underinsured families in applying for financial assistance programs such as Medical Assistance (Medicaid), the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), Pennsylvania Health Choices, New Jersey Family Care and children's health coverage programs in New Jersey in addition to Federal programs for which they may qualify. FHCP has added additional staff to assist in helping guide these families through the entire process. The program also provides follow up reviews to help the families throughout the eligibility determination process. Each time a family is referred, an assessment is completed and all available options are reviewed with the families. The goal is to ensure that the family receives all the assistance for which they qualify.

Priority 8: Access to dental, vision and specialty care for children Objective: Increase access to dental, vision and specialty care for children

Progress: CHOP opened its doors at the new Buerger Center for Advanced Pediatric Care on Monday, July 27, 2015. The new 12-story facility on CHOP's Main Campus in West Philadelphia was designed to reduce stress for patients and their families and

provide a smooth, efficient experience. Since July 27th, our clinical providers have seen over 13,000 patients.

CHOP also opened a new Specialty Care Center known as CHOP Specialty Care and Surgical Center-Brandywine Valley. It is located in Glen Mills, Pa, and serves patients from Delaware County, Chester County, and other surrounding areas. Monitoring CHOP's appointment access across the network has brought awareness to our divisions and enabled us to identify opportunities for improvement. Over the last three years, CHOP has opened evening and weekend appointment times to improve access for new patients. This has resulted in decreased wait times for new patient appointments and enhanced patient satisfaction.

In the community, CHOP's Homeless Health Initiative helps children access dental care and other crucial specialty care as needed. From January through December 2015, HHI coordinated 23 shelter visits, delivering free high quality medical and dental care to 169 children in shelters. There were 139 medical visits and 127 dental evaluations, made possible by more than 300 HHI volunteers. Of the children seen, 78 children were referred for medical follow up and 107 children were referred for dental follow up. In addition, CHOP's three Philadelphia Primary Care Centers partner with KidsSmiles, an urban dental provider in West Philadelphia that provides dental services and accepts all Medicaid plans. A Dental Community Educator from KidsSmiles provides patients in the Karabots waiting room with interactive education about gum and teeth health, oral hygiene, and brushing. In 2015, 2,462 CHOP patients received oral and overall health education and 2,026 parents of CHOP patients learned about Kids Smiles services and oral health care for their child. In the first year of the partnership, the Kids Smiles West Philadelphia dental center experienced a 40% increase in new patient appointments per month. An average of 360 new patients continue to be referred to Kids Smiles annually from the CHOP primary care centers.

CHOP also contracts with the University of Pennsylvania School of Dental Medicine to provide on-call dental services to CHOP patients in the Emergency Department who need to be seen for a related urgent dental care visit. On average, CHOP sees 685 dental patients on an annual basis.

In promoting access to vision screening and care, CHOP follows the Bright Futures guidelines at all primary care locations, and if a problem is found, CHOP refers the patient to the ophthalmology department, which cares for patients on our Main Campus at CHOP, as well as at CHOP specialty care centers in Brandywine Valley, King of Prussia, and Bucks County, Pa., and in Princeton and Voorhees, N.J.

PUBLIC HEALTH MANAGEMENT COPORATION QUALIFICATIONS

PHMC uses best practices **to improve community health** through direct service, partnership, innovation, policy, research, technical assistance, and a prepared workforce.

Public Health Management Corporation (PHMC) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation that was founded in 1972 to address problems in the organization and delivery of health and social services. PHMC is a public health institute that creates and sustains healthier communities and envisions a healthy community for all.

- In 2012, PHMC completed 28 Community Health Needs Assessments for Southeastern Pennsylvania non-profit hospitals, and has been assessing the health needs of the community since 1972. For a comprehensive list of completed assessments, see Appendix A.
- PHMC's Community Health Data Base is uniquely qualified to provide comprehensive CHNA services to not-for-profit hospitals. It is the only public health institute in Pennsylvania, has many years' experience collaborating with health care stakeholders, and can facilitate the participation of these diverse groups as required by the ACA.
- PHMC staff are public health experts who have conducted many CHNAs over the past 20 years for hospital, health departments, foundations, and other non-profits.

PHMC's CHNA qualifications also include developing and maintaining the Southeastern Pennsylvania Community Health Data Base (<u>www.CHDBdata.org</u>).

• The CHDB provides an unmatched set of information on local community health needs that can be used to develop focused findings supported by reliable data. These data can also be used in developing priorities and rationales for strategic plans that are ACA compliant.

The biennial SEPA Household Health Survey collects information on more than 13,000 residents (children, adults, and seniors) living in the five-county SEPA region. The survey is the longest running community health survey in the United States, as well as one of the largest regional surveys of its kind.

Francine Axler and Lisa R. Kleiner are the co-directors of this Community Health Needs Assessment.

Francine Axler, Executive Director, Community Health Data Base. Since 1989, Francine has been actively involved in the field of public health and health promotion, specifically in the collection and dissemination of health status, health behaviors, and utilization of health services data for residents of Southeastern Pennsylvania. Francine is particularly focused on teaching health and human service providers how to utilize community level health data to develop needed, effective and targeted health promotion programs for vulnerable populations. Francine directs PHMC's Community Health Data Base. She has a degree in sociology and a graduate degree in public health education.

Lisa Kleiner, Manager of Operations, Community Health Data Base. For the past twenty-eight years, Lisa has worked on a broad range of evaluation, research, and technical assistance projects. Lisa has conducted and coordinated over 50 population and community needs assessments focusing on older adults, racial/cultural minorities, persons with behavioral health needs, homeless families, maternal and child health, and other at-risk groups and communities. In addition to this expertise, Lisa has provided training and technical assistance to over 200 organizations to enable them to build their capacity to define and measure program outcomes and impact, tailoring the technical assistance to the specific needs of the organization and staff. Lisa has a law degree and a graduate degree in social work.

II. PROCESS AND METHODS

The five steps in the needs assessment process were:

- 1. defining the community;
- 2. identifying existing primary and secondary data and data needs;
- 3. collecting primary and secondary data;
- 4. analyzing data; and
- 5. preparing a written narrative report.

Additional hospital and geographic specific data, including significance testing, are supplied in the Appendices to allow The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia to further target community health needs. The data acquisition and analysis, community representatives, and information gaps are described in more detail below.

DATA ACQUISITION AND ANALYSIS

Both primary and secondary quantitative and qualitative data were obtained and analyzed for this needs assessment.

• Obtaining information from multiple sources, known as triangulation, helps provide context for information and allows researchers to identify results which are consistent across more than one data source.

Quantitative information from:

- the 2013 American Community Survey, and 2015 and 2020 Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts;
- Centers for Disease Control, Pennsylvania and School District of Philadelphia Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 2009 and 2013;
- Pennsylvania Health Department vital statistics on births, deaths, communicable diseases, and cancer incidence (2008-2012 and 2009-2012); and
- PHMC's 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey

were analyzed for the Hospital's CHNA area using the Statistical Program for Social Sciences (SPSS).

Frequency distributions were produced for variables for multiple years of data so trends over time could be identified and described. In addition, for Household Health Survey measures, tests of significance were conducted comparing the results for the CHNA area to the HHS results for Southeastern Pennsylvania to objectively identify and prioritize unmet needs.

In addition, quantitative data for each CHNA area from the HHS was compared to health objectives for the United States from HP 2020, and to data collected for Pennsylvania from the Center for Communicable Diseases' 2014 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey.

- Other information on the health of children in Philadelphia and Pennsylvania was added from the Pennsylvania Youth Risk Behavior Survey, the Adverse Childhood Experiences Survey and Pennsylvania Department of Health-State Health Improvement Plan findings and other data sets
- Professional Research Consultants (PRC) National Child & Adolescent Health Survey
- Pennsylvania Department of Human Services data (child welfare, behavioral health, Medicaid)
- Pennsylvania Children's Health Insurance Plan (CHIP)
- Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) County Health Rankings & Roadmaps
- Philadelphia Department of Public Health-Community Health Improvement Plan findings and other data sets

Qualitative information. PHMC also collaborated with CHOP to identify individuals living and/or working in the communities in the Hospital's CHNA area who could provide input on the needs assessment as community members, public health experts, and as leaders or persons with knowledge of underserved racial minorities, low income residents, and/or the chronically ill. CHOP and PHMC worked together to obtain meeting venues for the three community meetings, contact potential participants, and encourage attendance. Three meetings were held: South Philadelphia; Norristown, Montgomery County; and Kennett Square, Chester County.

- Meeting participants were not compensated;
- Participants who could not attend were invited to send written comments, but none were received.
- Input from the community meeting participants, including county and local health department officials and public health experts, was used to further identify and prioritize unmet needs, local problems with access to care, and populations with special health care needs.

Qualitative information from the community meetings was analyzed by identifying and coding themes common to participants, and also themes that were unique. This information was organized into major topic areas related to health status. The information from this needs assessment will be used by the Hospital to develop a community health implementation plan in collaboration with local health departments, and other area hospitals.

These sources are described in more detail in the next section.

PHMC SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA HOUSEHOLD HEALTH SURVEY

A total of 10,048 interviews were conducted with adults residing in the CHOP service area, 3,373 households with a selected child under the age of 18.

The 2015 Southeastern Pennsylvania Household Health Survey questionnaire examines health status and utilization of, and access to, health care among adults and children in the five-county area of Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties.

- The survey was conducted through telephone interviews with people 18 years of age and older living in 10,048 households in Southeastern Pennsylvania.
- A total of 2,029 cell phone interviews were conducted with adults in the fivecounty area. Cell phone respondents received the same survey questionnaire as landline respondents.

The survey includes many questions that have been administered and tested in national and local health surveys:

- National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS) for the National Health Interview Survey (NHIS);
- The Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance Survey (BRFSS);
- The California Women's Health Survey;
- The Social Capital Community Benchmark Survey (Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University); and
- The Survey on Childhood Obesity (Kaiser Family Foundation/San Jose Mercury News).

Households in each of the five counties were selected to guarantee representation from all geographic areas and from all population subgroups. When needed, the interviews were conducted in Spanish.

The survey was administered for PHMC by Abt/SRBI, Inc., a research firm in New York City, between December 2014 and March 2015.

The final sample of interviews is representative of the population in each of the five counties so that the results can be generalized to the populations of these counties. Within each selected household with more than one eligible adult, the Last Birthday Method was used to select the adult who last had a birthday as the respondent for the interview (with the exception of the cell phone sample).

- In households with children, the child under age 18 who most recently had a birthday was selected as the subject of the child interview.
- The survey incorporates over-samples of people ages 60-74 and 75 and older to provide a sufficient number of interviews for separate analyses of the responses of people in these subgroups.

U.S. CENSUS

This report includes data on the characteristics of the Hospital's CHNA area residents for the years 2013, 2015 and 2020. Data from the 2010 U.S. Census, estimates from the 2013 and 2015 American Community Survey, and the Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database projections for 2020 were also used. The Nielsen-Claritas Pop-Facts Database uses an internal methodology to calculate and project socio-demographic and socioeconomic characteristics for non-census years, relying on the U.S. Census, the Current Population Survey, and the American Community Survey.

VITAL STATISTICS

The most recent information on births, birth outcomes, deaths, cancer, and reportable diseases and conditions for residents of the hospital's CHNA area and Southeastern Pennsylvania was obtained from the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Bureau of Health Statistics and Research.

- Five year (2009-2012) annualized average rates for natality and four year (2008-2012) annualized average rates for mortality and were calculated by PHMC.
- Mortality rates were age-adjusted using the Direct Method and the 2000 U.S. standard million population.

The denominators for all 2008-2012 and 2009-2012 vital statistics rates for the county and state were interpolated from the 2010 U.S. Census and the 2015 American Community Survey. The number of women age 15-44 and age 15-17 were also interpolated from the 2010 US Census and 2015 American Community Survey.

COMMUNITY MEETINGS AND INTERVIEWS

CHOP and PHMC consulted with 27 residents and service providers in three in-depth community meetings to gain input for identifying community health needs, determine which were most significant, and prioritize them. These community members included government representatives, social service providers, and representatives of medically underserved, low-income, and minority populations. Participants to the meetings were identified by CHOP staff working with PHMC, and invited by mail or electronic mail to attend the meeting. PHMC also consulted individually with members of local health departments (Montgomery, Chester, Delaware, Philadelphia, and Bucks counties). Community representatives included the following individuals who are medically underserved and agencies that serve the medically underserved and low income and minority populations.

The community meetings were held at three different locations: Norristown Public Library, Montgomery County; La Comunidad Hispana, Kennett Square, Chester County; and South Philadelphia. The meetings were guided by a set of written questions that focused on participants' perceptions of the most important physical and behavioral health problems in the area, programs that successfully address these issues, gaps in services, barriers to care, vulnerable and underserved populations, and how to best reach individuals in the community. The input from these meetings is summarized in each section of this report, as pertinent.

INFORMATION GAPS

Quantitative information for socioeconomic and demographic information, vital statistics, and health data was available at the ZIP code level for the CHNA area. To fill potential gaps in information, these data were supplemented by detailed information about the CHNA area obtained from community meetings.


III. COMMUNITY DEMOGRAPHICS

This report includes a description of the demographic and socioeconomic characteristics of the residents of the CHNA area, because these characteristics are strong indicators of access to health care and good health. (For U.S. Census Tables, please see Appendix B).

DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

POPULATION SIZE

Philadelphia County has the largest population (1,562,939) of the five counties making up the CHOP service area, followed by Montgomery (817,612), Bucks (627,549), Delaware (563,729), and Chester (514,063) counties. Of these counties, Chester has the largest amount of growth since 2013 (3.4%), and Bucks the least (0.4%).



AGE

In general, across all five counties, the largest age group is the 18 to 44 year olds (ranging from 41% in Philadelphia to 31% in Bucks), followed by 45 to 65 (ranging from 31% in Bucks to 24% in Philadelphia), 0 to 17 (ranging from 21% in Bucks to 23% in Chester and Philadelphia) and 65+ (ranging from 16% in Montgomery and Bucks to 13% in Philadelphia).

- Bucks County is the only county in the CHOP service area with the same proportion of 18 to 44 year olds (31%) as 45 to 65 year olds (31%).
- It is predicted that all Counties except Philadelphia will have a 3% growth in the 65+ population between 2013 and 2020. In Philadelphia County, the 65+ population is only predicted to grow by 1% during this time period.
- Philadelphia County has the largest proportion of 18 to 44 year olds (41%) while Bucks has the smallest (31%).




Figure 1. Age Distribution of the Population by CHNA Areas, 2015

RACE AND ETHNICITY

The racial and ethnic makeup of the five counties in the CHOP service area varies greatly.

- Bucks County has the largest percentage of white residents (85%, representing 533,412 individuals) while Philadelphia has the lowest percentage (36%: 560,038)
- The County with the largest proportion of black residents is Philadelphia (41%) while the lowest is Bucks (4%).
- The proportion of the Asian population ranges from 5%-7% across the five Counties with the highest proportion (7%) seen in Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties and the lowest in Chester and Delaware Counties.
- The largest proportion of those individuals identifying as Latino are in Philadelphia County (14%: 216,347) and the smallest is in Delaware County (4%: 20,242).

The largest projected decline in population proportion is seen in the white population in Delaware County. In 2013, this group represented 69% of the population and in 2020 is predicted to represent 66% of the population, representing a 3% decline. The largest predicted increase in population is seen in the Latino population in Philadelphia County, where a 2%-3% increase is predicted for this group between 2013 and 2020.




Figure 2. Race and Ethnicity, CHOP service areas, 2015

LANGUAGES SPOKEN AT HOME

Bucks County has the largest percentage of people who speak English in the home (89%) while Philadelphia has the lowest (79%).

- Philadelphia County has the largest percentage of those who speak Spanish in the home (10%) while Delaware County has the lowest (2%).
- The percentage of households speaking an Asian language in the home ranges between 2% (Bucks) and 5% (Philadelphia) across the five Counties.
- Between 4% and 7% of households across the five Counties making up the CHOP service area speak a language within the household other than English, Spanish or an Asian language.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC INDICATORS

EDUCATION

Philadelphia has the highest proportion of residents (20%) with less than a high school education among the five counties making up the CHOP service area, while Bucks, Chester and Montgomery Counties had the least (7%).

- Almost one-half of the residents of Chester County (49%) have a college degree or more.
- The proportion of residents having a high school degree ranges from 57%-44% across the five-County CHNA service area.




Figure 3. Educational Attainment by CHNA Areas, 2015

EMPLOYMENT

The overwhelming majority of residents across the five Counties that make up the CHOP service area are employed. Employment rates are predicted to remain relatively steady between 2013 and 2020.


• The highest unemployment rate is seen in Philadelphia County (16%), which is more than a 1% increase since 2013. The lowest unemployment rate is in Chester and Montgomery Counties (7%).

POVERTY STATUS

Poverty varies widely between Counties in the CHOP service area, with Philadelphia County having the highest rate of poverty (32% of families with children living in poverty, plus 22% of families WITHOUT children) among the five CHNA areas.

• Montgomery and Bucks have the lowest rates of families living in poverty (6% of families with children are living in poverty).

MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME

The median household income in 2015 ranged from \$36,553 in Philadelphia County to \$83,868 in Chester County.

- In Philadelphia County, median household income is predicted to increase to \$39,155 in 2020.
- The largest predicted increase in median household income is in Montgomery County, where in 2015 it is \$80,561 and it is expected to increase to \$87,157 in 2020. Chester County is only predicted to have an increase to \$86,663 from \$83,868 during this same time period.

HOME OWNERSHIP

Forty-six percent of the population of Philadelphia rents their home and 54% are owners.

- Bucks and Chester Counties have the highest rates of home ownership in the CHOP service area. In Bucks County, 77% own their home and 23% rent, while in Chester County 76% own and 24% rent.
- Delaware County reports 70% home ownership, and Montgomery County reports a higher rate at 73%.
- Home ownership rates are predicted to remain stable across all five counties within the CHOP service area.




Figure 5. Homeownership by CHNA Areas, 2015

IV. HEALTH OF THE COMMUNITY

The health of a community can be assessed by comparing birth outcomes, selfreported health status and health conditions, communicable disease rates, selfreported health concerns and perceptions, and mortality rates to statewide indicators and HP 2020 goals for the nation. This section examines this information for the CHOP service area.

BIRTH OUTCOMES

FERTILITY RATES

There are 50,392 births annually to women living in the CHOP service area. This represents a fertility rate of 60 per 1,000 women age 15-44.

- The fertility rate in Philadelphia (64: representing 23,033 births) is the highest fertility rate among women in all of the CHOP service areas. Conversely, the Bucks County fertility rate (51: 5,662) is lowest among all the CHOP service areas.
- Latina women have the highest fertility rate (85: 6118) in the CHOP service area, while white women have the lowest (50: 26,230). Latina women in Chester County have the highest fertility rate (97: 711) while white women in Philadelphia County have the lowest fertility rate (43: 6,238).
- Women who identify as an "other" race or ethnicity in Montgomery County have a high fertility rate (95: 605), almost comparable with Latina women in Chester County.


Figure 6. Fertility Rates for Women Age 15-44 by Race/Ethnicity, 2009-2012



Infants born to teenagers have been associated with a number of negative birth outcomes, including prematurity and low birth weight, making it an important outcome to track.

The fertility rate for adolescents ages 15-17 living in the suburban CHNA area is 16 per 1,000. This represents 1,304 births annually.





- Lating women aged 15-17 have the highest fertility rate (40: 309) in the overall CHOP service area; it is 10 times higher (4: 215) than that of white women aged 15-17 within the area.
- The highest fertility rates for women aged 15-17 in the CHOP service area • are in Philadelphia County, where women identifying as "other" have the highest rate (51: 194), followed by Latina women (46: 232).
- Black women aged 15-17 in Philadelphia County have a fertility rate of 36 (representing 615 births) followed by white women (9:76) and Asian women (9:15).
 - The lowest fertility rates for women aged 15-17 in the CHOP service area are in Bucks County, where Latina women have a rate of 15, black women have a rate of 14, white women a rate of 3, and Asian a rate of 1.

LOW BIRTH WEIGHT

Low birth weight infants (<2,500 grams or 5lb 8 oz.) are at greater risk for dying within the first year of life than infants of normal birth weight.

In the CHOP service area, 90 infants per 1,000 live births are born with a low birth weight, representing 4,564 infants. This rate does not meet the HP 2020 target goal (78 per 1,000).




Figure 8. Rates of Infants Born at Low Birth Weight by Race/Ethnicity, 2009-2012


- Only the low birth weight rate for white infants (67 per 1,000) meets the HP 2020 target goal (78 per 1,000) in the CHOP service area.
 - Low birth weight rates of black (133), other (89), Latino (85) and Asian (80) infants do not meet the HP 2020 target goal.
- Black infants in the CHOP service area are almost twice as likely to be low birth weight as White infants (67 versus 133).
 - The low birth weight rate for black infants in all five CHNA counties does not meet the HP 2020 goal of 78 per 1,000. This is the only ethnic group that does not meet HP2020 goals in any county within the CHOP service area.
- The highest low birth weight rates within the CHOP service area are in Philadelphia County, where black infants are most likely to be born with a low birth weight (136: 1,497), followed by those identifying as "Other" (97: 326), Latino (96: 381), Asian (84: 118) and white (74: 460).
 - The lowest low birth weight rate among black infants in the CHOP service area is in Bucks County (106: 30), despite the fact that Bucks

County has the highest low birth weight rates for white (75: 347) and Asian (97: 33) infants.

PREMATURE BIRTHS

There are an average of 5,110 premature infant births (less than 37 weeks gestation) to women living in the CHOP service area, representing 10% of all live births.

- The highest premature birth rate is seen in Philadelphia County (12: 2,670) and the lowest in Montgomery County (8: 739).
- Black infants have the highest rate of premature birth in the CHOP service area (14: 1,956) and Asian infants at the lowest (8: 259).

PRENATAL CARE

Receiving pre-natal care during the first trimester of pregnancy can help ensure that health concerns are identified and addressed in a timely manner. About 36% of women in the CHOP service area initiate prenatal care after the first trimester or have no prenatal care (representing 17,221 live births). These birth outcomes do not meet the HP 2020 goal of 22.1%.

- Black women (52), those identifying as "other" (51), and Latina (49) women in the overall CHOP service area are more likely to receive late or no prenatal care than white women (24%).
- These rates do not meet the HP2020 goal.

- Furthermore, black and Latina women are more than twice as likely to receive prenatal care beginning after the first trimester or have no prenatal care as white women.
- Philadelphia County (46: 9,939) has the highest rate of women receiving late or no prenatal care, and Bucks County has the lowest rate (24: 1,350).

MORTALITY

INFANT MORTALITY

Every year, an average of 359 infants in the CHOP service area die before their first birthday. The CHNA area infant mortality rate is seven deaths per 1,000 live births.




Figure 11. Infant Mortality Rates by CHNA Area, 2009-2012

- This infant mortality rate (seven per 1,000 live births) does not meet the HP 2020 goal of six infant deaths per 1,000 live births.
- Black infants (13) have the highest mortality rate in the first year of life.
 - This is more than twice as high as the infant mortality rate for any other racial or ethnic group in the CHOP service area.
- Black infants in Montgomery County (16) have the highest infant mortality rate among the counties in the CHOP service area.
 - The black rate (16) is four times the mortality rate for white infants in the same county (four).

 Montgomery County has (four) the lowest infant mortality rate for White infants and the lowest infant mortality rate for all infants among all five counties in the CHOP service area (five).

MORTALITY

Philadelphia County has the highest mortality rate in the CHOP service area, at 893 deaths per 100,000 population, representing 14,009 deaths annually. Chester County has the lowest mortality rate in SEPA (634 per 100,000 population; representing 3,431 deaths annually).




Figure 12. Mortality Rates for Top Five Causes of Death by CHNA Areas, 2009-2012

Cancer of all types is the leading cause of death in the CHOP service area. Philadelphia County has the highest cancer death rate (212: 3,267) and Chester County has the lowest (160: 868). Chester is the only county in the CHOP service area that falls below the HP2020 goal of 161.4 for all Cancer deaths.

The second leading cause of death in the CHOP service area is coronary heart disease with Philadelphia County having the highest rate (153) and Bucks County having the lowest (83). Only Bucks and Montgomery Counties have rates that fall below the HP2020 goal of 103.4.

Stroke is the third leading cause of death is the CHOP service area. Philadelphia, is the only county in which stroke (45) and accidental death (45) tie for the third leading cause of death. Stroke as the third leading cause of death in all of the other counties in the CHOP service area. Chester County is the only area that has a stroke death rate (31) that falls below the HP2020 goal of 34.8 per 100,000 population.


The Diabetes death rates across all Counties in the CHOP service area falls far below the HP2020 goal of 66.6. Philadelphia has the highest diabetes death rate (23) and Chester has the lowest (11).

The homicide mortality rate in Philadelphia County (19) is more than double the other County rates in the CHOP service area. Bucks County has the lowest homicide rate (one).

Only two counties (Philadelphia and Montgomery) in the CHOP service area have suicide death rates that fall below the HP2020 target of 10.2 per 100,000. Bucks County (13) has the highest suicide death rate in the CHOP service area.

The highest HIV death rate in the CHOP service area is in Philadelphia County (eight) and the lowest is in Montgomery (one), Bucks (one) and Chester Counties (one). The HP2020 goal for HIV mortality is 3.3 per 100,000, and Philadelphia County exceeds this goal.

Lung cancer is the leading cause of death among all cancer sites for residents of all five counties in the CHOP service area, followed by prostate cancer and female breast cancer, colorectal cancer, and female genital cancer.


- Not one county in the CHOP service area meets the HP2020 goal for breast cancer mortality (20.7) and only one county—Montgomery (14)-falls below the HP2020 goal for Colorectal Cancer (14.5).
- Delaware County is the only county within the CHOP service area that has a higher prostate death rate (34) than breast cancer death rate (29).

MORBIDITY

HIV and AIDS

Philadelphia County has the highest rate of individuals living with HIV, including AIDS (46 per 100,000 populations) followed by Delaware County (16). The lowest rate of individuals living with HIIV, including AIDS is in Chester and Montgomery County (six).

Communicable Disease

Chlamydia represents the highest rate of morbidity resulting from a communicable disease in the CHOP service area. Philadelphia has the highest rate (1,317) followed by Delaware County (458). The lowest Chlamydia rate is seen in Bucks County (163).

• The gonorrhea rate in Philadelphia County (447) is far greater than rates in any other county within the CHOP service area, with Delaware County representing the second highest rate (115) and Bucks the lowest (23).

Chester (134), Bucks (75) and Montgomery (44) Counties have Lyme disease rates that are higher than rates we see in the State of Pennsylvania as a whole (34).

Pertussis rates in Delaware (19) and Montgomery (18) are almost twice as high as the rate we see in the state of Pennsylvania overall (10).

Hepatitis B rates in Delaware (35) and Philadelphia (31) Counties are more than twice as high as the rates we see in the State of Pennsylvania overall (14).





Figure 15. Communicable Disease Incidence per 100,000, 2013-2014

ELEVATED BLOOD LEAD LEVELS

Elevated levels of lead in the blood of children greater than $10 \mu/dL$ can have serious permanent effects on health status, cognition and behavior. Rates of elevated blood lead levels in children ages 5-9 are similar across the five counties of Southeastern Pennsylvania, but are lowest in Bucks County (0.3%) and highest in Philadelphia (0.9%).¹

According to the CDC, in 2014 there were 11 children ages 5-9 (0.3%) who tested positive for elevated lead levels in the blood (≥10 µ/dL) in Bucks County, 35 (0.8%) in Chester County, 52 (0.7%) in Delaware County, 49 (0.7%) in Montgomery County, and 338 (0.9%) in Philadelphia County.

HEALTH STATUS


An **overwhelming majority** of children in the service area describe their health as excellent, good, or very good.

CHILDREN'S OVERALL HEALTH STATUS

Self-reported health status is one of the best indicators of population health. This measure has consistently shown to correlate very strongly with mortality rates.²

• While most children are in excellent, good or very good health, about one in 20 children in the CHOP service area, or about 42,700, are in fair or poor health.

Within the service area, children living in poverty³ are much more likely than other children to be in fair or poor health.

- One in nine children living in poverty (11%) is in fair or poor health, as compared with 2% of children living above 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- A greater percentage of black and Latino children are in fair or poor health (7% and 12%, respectively) as compared with white children (3%).




Figure 18. Health Status of Children 0-17 by Race/Ethnicity, 2015

CHILD ASTHMA

Asthma is one of the leading causes of school absenteeism⁴ and can impact all areas of a child's life. Attendees at community meetings identified asthma as a major health issue for children.

Eighteen percent of children in the service area (167,500) have been diagnosed with asthma. Diagnoses increase with age, and by the time children in the service area are teenagers, 24% have been diagnosed with asthma.

• Child asthma is highest in Delaware and Philadelphia Counties (21%), while 16% of Bucks County children have been diagnosed, as have 15% in Montgomery and Chester Counties.





Figure 19. Asthma, Children 0-17 by CHNA Areas, 2015

More than one in five children living in poverty has been diagnosed with asthma (22%) as compared with 17% living above 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Figure 20. Children 0-17 Diagnosed with Asthma by Poverty Status, 2015



Racial disparities in childhood asthma have been well documented, and persist within the service area.

• Black children experience the highest asthma rates, with 26% diagnosed, and followed by Latino (20%), Asian (16%), and white children (15%).

OVERWEIGHT AND OBESITY

The Healthy People 2020 goal for childhood obesity is a target of 14.5% of children ages 2-19.


Among children, overweight and obesity are classified by body mass index (BMI) percentile for age. Children at the 85th percentile through 94th percentile for their age are considered overweight, while children at the 95th percentile or above are considered obese.

Childhood overweight and obesity can have long-term health effects. Community meeting participants listed obesity as a primary concern for both adults and children in the service area.

More than one in five children in the service area (21%) are obese, and 16% are overweight.

• Child obesity varies widely across Southeastern Pennsylvania, with 10% of children in Chester County and 32% of Philadelphia children classified as obese.

DIABETES

Diabetes in children remains rare in Pennsylvania. The most recent data available were from 2012, with .33% of school children reporting a Type I diabetes and .07% reporting a Type II diabetes diagnosis. ⁵

In 2012, the prevalence of students in school in SEPA counties with Type 1 diabetes varied from a low of .28% in Philadelphia to a high of .36% in Chester County. The prevalence of Type II diabetes diagnoses varied from a low of .03% in Bucks County to a high of .08% in Philadelphia County.

MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Community meeting attendees listed mental and behavioral health services for children among the most important issues in children's health in the service area. Participants mentioned difficulties with referral, as well as the issues faced by parents and caregivers trying to navigate the mental health system. Children with private insurance can access specialty care in Delaware, but that isn't available to children with CHIP coverage. Mental and behavioral health care for families that speak only Spanish, or another non-English language, is even harder to come by.

MENTAL HEALTH STATUS

Depression. The YRBS asked participants about "feeling sad or hopeless" in the past year.⁶ Those who said that they felt this way "almost every day for two weeks in a row" so that they "stopped doing some usual activities" are considered at high risk for depression.

In Pennsylvania as a whole, one in four (24%) participants overall reported depressive symptoms; these varied by gender, with nearly one in three (31%) of the girls surveyed reporting symptoms, compared to half that rate among boys (16%).

• The rate of symptoms was higher in Philadelphia, where nearly one in three participants (30%) reported this severity of symptoms, including 38% of girls and 21% of boys.

Suicidal Ideation. In the YRBS, 14% of high school students in Pennsylvania as a whole reported "seriously considering suicide" in the past year.

• A similar proportion (13%) in Philadelphia considered suicide.

More girls than boys reported this type of suicidal ideation, with nearly one in 5 (19%) of girls in Pennsylvania reporting this intensity of thoughts as compared to 8% of boys.

- Similar proportions of girls (18%) and boys (8%) reported suicidal ideation in Philadelphia
- However, students in Philadelphia were more likely to report making an attempt: 10% of students reported attempting suicide in the past year in Philadelphia, compared to 6% in Pennsylvania as a whole.

The suicide rate for adolescents and young adults in SEPA as a whole (2009-2012) was 7.0 deaths per 100,000. However, rates varied substantially by county.


- Bucks County had the highest rate of youth and young adult suicide, with 9.8 deaths per 100,000.
- Chester County (8.5 per 100,000) and Delaware County (7.5 per 100,000) were second and third.
- Montgomery County and Philadelphia County had the lowest rates of adolescent and young adult suicide, with 5.3 and 5.7 deaths per 100,000, respectively.

CHILD ABUSE

The Healthy People 2020 goal for mistreatment of children under the age of 18 is for fewer than 8.5 children per 1,000 to report mistreatment. In Southeastern Pennsylvania, most areas met this goal.

In 2012, Bucks (6.1 per 1,000), Chester (6.4), Delaware (7.5) and Montgomery (5.5) Counties met the goal for reported mistreatment of children.

However, Philadelphia had a higher rate of child mistreatment reports in 2012 than the HP 2020 goal (13.2 compared to 8.5).

ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE

Regular healthcare allows children to receive earlier, less expensive treatment, get well sooner, and prevents costly complications and longer illnesses.

HEALTH INSURANCE STATUS

The Healthy People 2020 goal for health insurance coverage is 100% of persons with medical insurance. Ninety-eight percent of children in the CHOP service area have public or private health insurance coverage. This does not meet the Healthy People 2020 goal for health insurance coverage.

While most children in the service area have health insurance coverage, about 21,300 (2%) do not.

Attendees at community meetings said that enrollment is a frustrating process, and making an appointment with a specialist who accepts the child's insurance can be challenging. Insuring children in families with mixed immigration status was also listed as a difficulty.

Among Latino children in the CHOP service area, 7% have no public or private health insurance, while 1-2% of children in other racial and ethnic groups are uninsured.




Figure 24. No Health Insurance by Race/Ethnicity, Children 0-17, 2015

INFORMATION ACCESS

Caregivers of children were asked how they preferred to receive information about health and social services. Most caregivers prefer to receive information by email or postal mail.

- About 40% of children live in households where their caregiver prefers to receive this information by email, while 31% prefer to receive it by postal mail, though there is a socioeconomic difference.
 - Children living below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level are more likely to live in households where their caregivers prefer postal mail (41%, as compared with 26% of children living above 150% of the Federal Poverty Level).
 - Email preferences are reversed for children living above 150% of poverty, with 43% of non-poor children living in households with caregivers that prefer email, as compared with 29% of poor children.

While fewer children live in households where their caregivers prefer to receive this information by social media (11% of children), many children have caregivers who report using social media to connect with community organizations providing services.

Nearly half of children (48%) have caregivers who connect with these organizations via social media, and there is little difference by income level.

The caregivers of more than half of white children (52%), 45% of Latino children, 44% of black children and 39% of Asian children have connected with community organizations on social media sites.

PRIMARY CARE

According to Healthy People 2020, at least 95% of all people should have a specific source of ongoing care. The CHOP service area meets this goal.


Ninety-six percent of children in the CHOP service area have a regular source of healthcare, a place where the child can go when they are sick or their caregiver needs advice about the child's health. Having a regular source of care is important since children who have a regular source of care are more likely to receive care when they are sick compared with those who do not.

Across the CHOP service area, 31,800 children have no regular source of care.

Among children in the CHOP service area with a regular source of care, 85% receive that care at a private doctor's office, though children in poverty are more likely to receive that care elsewhere.

- Just two-thirds of children in poverty with a regular source of care (65%) receive that care at a private doctor's office, as compared with 93% of children living above 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- Among children in poverty with a regular source of care, 18% receive their care at a community health center or public clinic, 13% receive it at a hospital outpatient clinic, and 5% receive their care somewhere else.

Figure 25. Type of Settling for Regular Care, Children, 2015




Latino children are more likely to receive their regular care at clinics:

- 22% of those with a regular care provider go to a community health center or public clinic and
- 9% receiving their care at a hospital outpatient clinic.

This is a higher use of community health centers than for:

- Black children (12% get care at community health centers or public clinics and 15% get care at hospital outpatient clinics);
- Asian children (6% and 8%, respectively); and
- White children (about 2% of white children receive care at either a public or hospital clinic).

IMMUNIZATIONS

The most recent data from the 2014 National Immunization Survey⁷ data show that the recommended immunization series for the 19 to 35-month-old-age group is 78% in Pennsylvania as a whole, and 76% in Philadelphia. These are approaching the Health People 2020 goal of 80% of this combined series of immunizations.

The National Immunization survey from 2014 also indicates more detail about specific immunizations (CDC, 2015a).⁸ Pennsylvania children age 19 to 35 months are close to, or exceeding, the Healthy People 2020 immunization goals of 90% for the MMR (92%), and DTaP (86%) vaccines. However, Pennsylvania children are behind in hepatitis C (79%) and hepatitis A (62%), a pattern seen in Philadelphia as well.

For kindergarteners in Pennsylvania, high (92%) rates of MMR vaccination are maintained, according to records for the 2014-2015 school year (CDC, 2015b). Similarly, 92% of kindergarten enrollees have been vaccinated against varicella with the 2-dose vaccine regimen, and 94% have been vaccinated against diphtheria and tetanus. For all of these vaccines, Pennsylvania kindergarten students are close to the Healthy People 202 goals of vaccinating 95% of children in this age group. However, pertussis vaccination is not required in Pennsylvania, so data on this are not available.

For adolescents 13-17, the National Immunization Survey- teen showed that more than 90% of teens in Pennsylvania overall and Philadelphia specifically were vaccinated as recommended for diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis (adult T-daP vaccine), measles, mumps, rubella (MMR) and meningitis.

However, adolescent vaccination with the HPV vaccine was lower, and varied by gender. In Pennsylvania overall, 67% of girls had at least one dose of the HPV vaccine, and 48% had completed the three dose course of the vaccines. In Philadelphia, 80% of girls had at least one dose, and 59% had completed the three dose vaccine regimen. Fewer boys were vaccinated, with only 47% of boys in Pennsylvania and 63% of boys in Philadelphia starting the vaccinations for HPV, and only 26% of boys in Pennsylvania overall and 35% of boys in Philadelphia specifically completing the three-dose vaccination schedule.

DENTAL CARE

Attendees at community meetings mentioned insurance barriers to dental care for adults and children, indicating the difficulty many people have getting dental coverage, or finding a dentist that accepts their type of insurance coverage.

Nearly one in five children in the service area (18% or about 161,000) did not have a dental visit during the past year.

Poor children are more likely to go without dental care than non-poor children.

• About one-quarter of children living below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level (24%) went without a dental checkup compared to 16% of children living above 150% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Racial and ethnic gaps in dental care exist within the service area. Asian children are less likely to get dental care.

• About one-quarter of Asian children (24%) had no dental visit in the past year, compared with 21% of black children, and 17% of both Latino and white children.






Figure 27. No Dental Visit in the Past Year by Race/Ethnicity, Children 0-17, 2014-2015

Older children in the service area were more likely to have had a dental visit in the past year than were children under age 5.

• 94% of children ages 6 to 12 visited a dentist in the past year, as had 90% of teenagers, compared to 58% of children under 5.

There is geographic variation in dental care for children as well: in Philadelphia and Delaware Counties, 20% of children have gone without a dental visit in the past year, as have 16% in Montgomery County and 14% in Bucks and Chester Counties.

About 35,000 children in the service area (4%) did not receive dental care in the past year due to cost, and this varied among racial and ethnic groups.

• Latino children (9%) are more likely to miss necessary dental care because of the cost of care in the past year, as did 6% of black children, 4% of Asian children and 2% of white children.




Figure 29. Cost Barriers to Dental Care by Race/Ethnicity, Children, 2015

HEALTH BEHAVIORS

NUTRITION

Healthy eating can be a struggle for many children in the service area. Community meeting participants noted that children who depend on school meals suffer during summers, and that food insecurity is invisible in Montgomery County during the summer. Parents in the service area may not be aware of existing programs, like summer meal services. One attendee indicated that healthy lifestyle changes are difficult for families with limited financial resources, so they become "almost impossible for families that are also dealing with other stresses."

Only one-quarter of children in the CHOP service area (26%) eat a healthy diet, which should include four or more servings of fruits and vegetables each day; 74% are not eating healthy foods.

- This represents more than 579,000 children.
- On average, younger children eat more fruits and vegetables than older children.
- One-third of children ages 0-5 in the service area, 33%, eat four or more servings of fruits and vegetables, as do 25% of children ages 6-12 and 23% of teenagers.




Figure 30. Number of Servings of Fruits and Vegetables by Age Group, 2014-2015

Fruit and vegetable consumption varies geographically.

• In Delaware County, 18% of children eat fewer than four servings of fruits and vegetables each day, while in Montgomery County 30% of children eat fewer than four servings each day.


EXERCISE

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends that children get 60 minutes of physical activity each day⁹.

Within the CHOP service area, 18% of children are physically active fewer than three times each week.

• Younger children are more active than older children: 11% of children under 5 years of age are active fewer than three times per week, as are 17% of children ages 6-12, and 22% of teenagers.

Children in households with lower incomes are less likely to be physically active;

• 22% of children living below 150% of the Federal Poverty Level are active fewer than three times per week, as compared with 17% of other children.




Figure 32 . Children Physically Active Less than Three Times Each Week, by Race/Ethnicity, 2015

Latino children are less physically active than children in other racial and ethnic groups.

• About 23% of Latino children, 20% of black and Asian children, and 17% of white children are active fewer than three times per week.

Community meeting attendees listed the cost of physical activity programs for children as a barrier to exercise. In addition to the cost of summer camps and afterschool programs, one participant noted that there aren't enough spaces on the sports teams and recreational programs. In some communities, attendees indicated that children aren't safe playing outside.

HOUSING INSECURITY

Insecure housing is a widely recognized as an important social determinant of health and is linked to a wide range of poor health outcomes, especially for children.

Households that spend more than 30% of their pre-tax income on housing expenses are at high risk for housing insecurity.

• In Southeastern Pennsylvania, a majority of renting households (55%) spent more than 30% of their income on rent in 2015.

The high rate of housing insecurity among renting households was remarkably consistent across counties, ranging from a low of 49% in Chester County to a high of 58% in Philadelphia.

One in three (33%) home-owning households spent more than 30% of their income on housing.

• Philadelphia also had the highest proportion of home owning households with housing insecurity, with 39% of home-owning households paying more than 30% of pre-tax income for housing expenses.

TOBACCO USE

The 2015 Philadelphia Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) asks high school students about a wide variety of substances used, including tobacco.¹⁰

One-third (33%) of high school students in Philadelphia report ever smoking cigarettes, with 2% reporting smoking cigarettes 20+ days in the past 30 days.

- About six percent (6%) of Philadelphia students reported using smokeless tobacco products.
- Philadelphia students were more likely to report using cigars or cigarillos in the past month (10%) than cigarettes (7%).

Philadelphia high school students were more likely to report using electronic vapor devices than smoking cigarettes in the past month (39% compared to 33%).

Among male and female students, similar percentages have used cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, cigars, and electronic vapor devices.

Cigarette smoking and electronic vapor device use increase with grade level.

- Twenty seven percent of ninth graders have tried cigarettes compared to 43% of twelfth graders.
- One-third (33%) of ninth graders have used an electronic vapor device compared to 46% of twelfth graders.

ALCOHOL AND SUBSTANCE USE

According to the YRBS, more than one in four high school students in Philadelphia (27%) reported drinking alcohol in the past 30 days.

• About one in nine students (11%) reported binge drinking in the past 30 days.

A large minority of students have tried marijuana in Philadelphia: two in five (40%) high school students have ever used marijuana, and one in five (21%) have used it in the past 30 days.

Other drug use is far less common.

The most common use of substances other than marijuana by Philadelphia students are prescription drugs (such as painkillers, anti-anxiety medications, or Ritalin) without a prescription (13%).

• Inhalants are the second most commonly substance after prescription drugs among Philadelphia students (8%).

Substance use rates among male and female students in Philadelphia are relatively similar. However, binge drinking and taking prescription drugs without a prescription increase steadily from ninth graders (6% and 11%, respectively) to twelfth graders (21% and 19%, respectively).

VIOLENCE

Carrying a weapon. About one in eight high school students (12%) carried a weapon, such as a gun, knife, or club, in the past 30 days; 5% carried a gun.

- Male students were almost two times more likely to carry a weapon than female students (17% compared to 9%).
- Eight percent of Philadelphia male high school students reported carrying a gun in the past month compared to 2% of female students.
- Similar percentages of ninth and twelfth graders carried a weapon in the past month (14% and 15%, respectively).

Involvement in physical fights. More than one-third of Philadelphia students (35%) reported being in a physical fight in the past year.

• More male students than female students reported being in a fight in the past year: two in five male students (41%) reported fighting compared to three in ten (30%) female students.

Bullying. In Philadelphia, 14% of students reported past-year bullying on school property; females (15%) were slightly more likely to report being bullied at school than males (12%).

• Ten percent of students reported being electronically bullied in the past year, including through email, chat rooms, instant messaging, websites, or texting.

SEXUAL ACTIVITY AND CONTRACEPTIVE USE

One-half of Philadelphia high school students (50%) have had sexual intercourse, according to the 2015 YRBS.

More than one-third (36%) of high school students in Philadelphia have been sexually active in the past three months.

Nine percent of sexually active high school students in Philadelphia report that they did not use any method to prevent pregnancy the last time they had sex. One in five sexually active high school students in Philadelphia (21%) did not use a condom the last time they had sex.

Males are more likely to engage in sexual intercourse than females, and more likely to use a condom during sex than females.

- Males were more to have ever had sexual intercourse (57%) than females (45%).
- Males were also more likely to have engaged in sexual intercourse within the past three months than females (39% versus 33%, respectively).
- Female students were slightly more likely to not use a condom than males, with 22% of Philadelphia females not using a condom at last sex compared to only 18% of Philadelphia males.

Among different high school grade cohorts, sexual activity and condom use increases between ninth and twelfth grades.

- More than one-third (38%) of ninth graders have had sexual intercourse compared to more than two-thirds (68%) of twelfth graders.
- Only 24% of ninth graders use a condom compared to 39% of high school seniors.

MENTAL HEALTH

More than one-third (34%) of Philadelphia high school students experienced feelings of hopelessness or sadness for two weeks that caused them to stop their usual activities.

- Fifteen percent have seriously considered attempting suicide at some point in their lives, and 12% have attempted suicide in the past year.
- One in five students (20%) has performed acts of self-harm in the past year without wanting to die.

• Seventeen percent of students tried to lose or keep from gaining weight by not eating for 24 hours or more.

Female high school students are twice as likely to have feelings of hopelessness as male students (44% versus 22%, respectively).

- Similarly, female students (19%) are nearly twice as likely to have ever seriously considered attempting suicide as male students (11%).
- Female students were slightly more likely to have attempted suicide in the past year than male students (13% versus 9%, respectively).

Mental health indicators vary considerably by grade level; high school seniors are more likely to report better mental health than ninth graders.

- For example, 39% of ninth graders report having had feelings of sadness or hopelessness for two weeks in their lifetime compared to 30% of high school seniors.
- One in five (20%) ninth graders has seriously considered attempting suicide compared to one in nine (11%) twelfth graders.
- Nearly one-quarter of ninth graders (24%) have performed acts of self-harm in the past year compared to 16% of twelfth graders.

VIII. UNMET NEEDS

The unmet health care needs for The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia CHNA area were identified and prioritized by comparing the health status, access to care, health behaviors, and utilization of services for residents of the CHNA area to the state's health priorities and Healthy People 2020 goals for the nation. The current needs assessment, conducted by Public Health Management Corporation, builds upon previously identified unmet health needs using more recent data to review the following health needs and priorities of communities in the CHOP service area. The previous needs assessment found the following unmet needs: (1) improved access to primary and preventive care and health education for children, particularly for children living in poverty or with special needs; (2) improved access to specialty care, including dental and vision care; (3) improved access to mental and behavioral health services; (4) Education programs to address cultural and language barriers, especially among caregivers who do not speak English; (5) education to address chronic disease management, especially asthma and behavioral and mental health; (6) education and interventions to address overweight and obesity prevention for children; and (7) access to pregnancy prevention, behavioral health and substance use for teens.

Since the service area consists of all of SEPA, significance testing to determine what areas should be prioritized compared to the rest of SEPA could not be completed. However, themes of types of unmet needs are still clear.

In 2015, the majority (95%) of the children in the CHOP service area were in excellent, very good, or good health. However, 5% (representing more than 42,000 children in SEPA), are in fair or poor health.

- Improved access to primary and preventive care for vulnerable children: According to community meeting attendees and data sources, only a small proportion of children do not have a primary care provider. However, the children who do not have a primary care provider are likely a vulnerable group.
 - One in 25 children (4%) do not have a regular source of care, according to the Household Health Survey. Although this suggests that challenges to accessing primary care are rare, the Healthy People 2020 goal is for 100% of children under 18 to have a "regular place" for receiving care to ensure appropriate continuity of care.

- Community members reported that hours and locations of primary care locations are often challenging to access, especially when children need urgent care and for parents who do not have access to a car.
- Access to care for children in immigrant families was a serious concern for the community members, despite some very good programs targeting this population. Children who are undocumented or in mixed-status families face particularly difficult challenges with access to care. Getting children to a care provider can be especially difficult when some children in the family are eligible for CHIP and others are not, because they may need to receive care from difference practices.
- Primary care access is also a concern for some older adolescents who need to bring themselves in for care. Furthermore, community members expressed concern about continuity of care when adolescents need sexual health care or when it is time to transition to an appropriate adult medical home, especially if they lose CHIP and do not get other insurance.
- Improved access to specialists, dental, and vision care: Access to these needed health resources continues to be a serious issue for children in SEPA.
 - Community meeting attendees in all of the locations discussed the challenges of accessing specialist appointments for children. Because so few specialists serve children, getting an appointment with one that takes a child's insurance can be a serious challenge.
 - For low income parents outside Philadelphia, the transportation challenge of getting a child to a distant specialist's office can make an appointment a daunting all-day event.
 - Access to dental care varied by community in SEPA. Although community meeting attendees reported that most children can receive dental screenings in schools, access to affordable dental care for children can be a challenge, especially for children who are not eligible for CHIP. The Household Health survey data indicates that about one in six children (18%) did not visit a dentist in the past year, and that about one in 25 (4%) needed dental care that they did not get because of cost.
 - Access to sex education, sexual health services, and OB-GYN services for teens.
 - Community members discussed these needs, and pointed out that in PA, adolescents are able to consent to treatment, but that they may not know this or know where to go to get sexual health services if they need or want them.
 - One in five sexually active young people in Philadelphia did not use birth control, and two in five did not use a condom the last time they had sex, putting themselves at risk for pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections.

- Some groups of young women age 15-17 have high fertility rates across SEPA counties, including black (33.1 births per 1,000) and Latinas (40.4 births per 1,000). Birth rates for this age group are highest in Philadelphia County for each ethnicity recoded in vital stats data.
- Access to mental health, behavioral health, and substance abuse screening, education, and services are needed for children and families in the service area.
 - Community meeting attendees emphasized the widespread nature of trauma, including the intergenerational transmission of trauma from domestic violence and community violence, and the need for a trauma-informed perspective in all types of services.
 - Fighting and bullying are common: according to YRBS data, about one in three Philadelphia high school students has been involved in a physical fight at school and about one in six has been bullied at school. Community meeting attendees discussed gang activity in neighborhoods in Philadelphia and Norristown as a safety issue for children and youth, but indicate that more adults are directly involved than children. Bullying and fighting may be both a symptom and a cause of behavioral and mental health challenges and a need for treatment.
 - Alcohol, marijuana, and other substances were commonly reported in the YRBS for both available geographic breakdowns—Pennsylvania as a whole and Philadelphia. Both areas have higher rate of use than the HP 2020 goal of 18.4 or fewer using either in the past 30 days; at least one in three adolescents in both the city and the state reported alcohol use, and at least 20% reported marijuana use. Furthermore, community members reported concerns about "hard" substance use, especially use of opioid painkillers, potentially leading to later heroin use.
 - Community meeting attendees were particularly concerned about access to psychiatrists and other mental health specialists for children and adolescents. It is nearly impossible to find psychiatrists who take children, which means that many who may need medication to manage a mental health condition cannot benefit from it. Other providers are also difficult to access.
- Access to healthy food, opportunities for physical activity, and wellness education are needed for children in the service area.
 - Healthy eating can be a challenge for many in the service area.
 Community meeting attendees noted that middle and low income families, especially those who have unstable housing, may face challenges with access to healthy foods. They were particularly concerned about nutrition knowledge and choices among older children and teens, and expressed concerns about the eating habits of older children who may be responsible for their own meals. Data from the HHS

shows that most children do not eat enough vegetables, and that vegetable consumption decreases with age, indicating age-related concerns are valid.

- Physical activity was also a concern for community meeting attendees, who were concerned that there is not enough access to activity at school, in after-school activities, or at home. These concerns were upheld by HHS data: about one in five children in the service area are not physically active at least three times a week, and physical activity is more of a problem with increasing age.
- Obesity was also a concern expressed by meeting attendees, and connected to the nutrition and physical activity concerns they expressed. In the service area, the obesity rates of children are higher than Healthy People 2020 goals, which call for obesity rates under 16.1%-in SEPA, over 21% of children are obese—and obesity is over the HP 2020 threshold in Philadelphia, Montgomery, and Delaware counties.
- Increased collaboration and communication to create a more seamless approach between services.
 - One of the major themes at community meetings was the complexity of the systems that children and families must navigate to access services, and the importance of the systems working together for the best outcomes for children. Attendees in many different roles suggested that children and parents needed to be linked to all the resources possible regardless of where they started.
 - The challenge of navigating the system is more difficult for lower income families, families whose first language is not English, and parents with less education.
- Increased access to education, primary care and other health services for families and children who do not speak English. Despite clear efforts to increase access to appropriate education and linguistic services, some gaps remained, according to community members.
 - Education about the U.S. health-care model is needed for some parents to understand preventive medicine and the idea of a "medical home."
 - Health education and interpretation efforts could especially improve for families who speak languages other than English and Spanish, according to the community meeting attendees.




