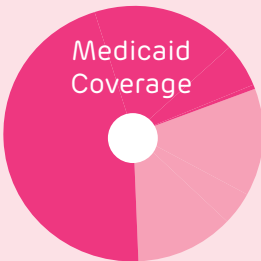
ACCESS TO CARE & NAVIGATING THE HEALTH SYSTEM

patients and families helped by Family Health Coverage Program to enroll in Medicaid and CHIP

new refugee children evaluated by our Refugee Health Program, which also conducted **148 follow-up visits**

ACCESS TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

120 children

enrolled in intensive emotional and behavioral health programs in our Mays Landing Specialty Care Center



5,000+ youth

screened for risk of suicide in the Emergency Department

136 children

received in-school group behavioral health counseling from 20 CHOP-trained school counselors and social workers



HEALTH EDUCATION

CHOP focuses on keeping children healthy by providing health-related information in person, over the phone and on the web.

VIOLENCE PREVENTION INITIATIVE

900 students

participated in PRAISE, our school-based bullying prevention program

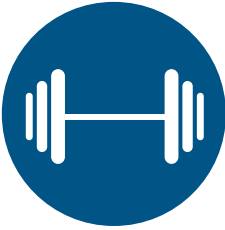
1,600 children

CHRONIC CONDITIONS

CHOP's community programs prioritize helping families manage chronic conditions like asthma and prevent lifelong problems like obesity.



750+ children

and their mothers participated in Operation CHOICES fitness and nutrition classes offered by HHI in three homeless shelters for mothers with children

by Community Asthma Prevention Program (CAPP) to homes

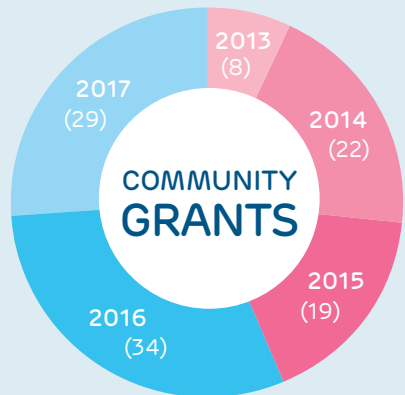
