Team-based Approach

Upon admission, each patient is evaluated by the rehabilitation team to determine functional mobility, self-care, cognitive abilities and safety. Our physicians, nurses, therapists, and professional and support staff work together with the patient and their family to coordinate and update care and rehabilitation goals for discharge. The team will develop an individualized treatment plan and monitor progress towards goals. We have a strong focus on quality of care and outcomes throughout the rehab stay. Our goal is to return our patients to home and have them realize their maximal recovery, function and self-sufficiency.


Our Strength in Numbers

Patient and Caregiver Satisfaction

Feedback about our services is important to us. This year we began collecting feedback from multiple sources including each patient! This guides our decision-





making and allows us to make changes that will be most beneficial to all those involved in the rehab process. This year we found that our patients and their caregivers had a very positive opinion of the rehab unit with a very high likelihood of recommending the rehab unit.

We also began collecting feedback from our referral sources, both internal and external providers. Their feedback showed that they were unaware of the admission criteria for the rehab unit. We used this feedback to add the admission criteria to our websites for easier access.

OUR OUTCOMES


Length of Stay

Our aim is to get children home as soon as possible, and we work with patients and caregivers to achieve this goal. We will continue to work to improve (i.e., decrease) our length of stay.





We use the **WeeFIM II** ® to assess functional status at admission and to track progress of each of our patients throughout their rehab stay. The WeeFIM also provides a method to evaluate outcomes for pediatric rehabilitation programs. We will continue to work to improve our WeeFIM score changes from the time of admission to discharge.




Outcomes After Discharge

100% of caregivers reported that the patient was functioning the same or better at least three months after discharge.
