

## 2025-2026 CHOP Leadership Education in Adolescent Health (LEAH): Psychology Post-Doctoral LEAH Fellowship

The Division of Adolescent Medicine at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) is recruiting for a 1-2-year fellowship to start July-September 1, 2025. Opportunities exist for involvement in ongoing research related to adolescent health. The LEAH psychology fellow will complete a Research or Community Leadership Project and teach and mentor Master's level and physician trainees in the LEAH program. Opportunities for clinical training are available if desired.

The CHOP Leadership Education in Adolescent Health (LEAH) fellowship program provides interdisciplinary leadership training in adolescent health for 5 core disciplines including medicine, nursing, nutrition, psychology, and social work with a focus on improving the health and well-being of adolescents and young adults (AYAs) ages 10-25. This pre- and post-doctoral training prepares health professionals for leadership roles in public health, clinical care, research, training, and/or advocacy with the goal of improving youth-centered, family-involved, community-based services, health equity for AYAs and enhancing the capacity of public health Title V programs to respond to current/emerging health needs of youth. LEAH fellows are expected to have clear long-term interests in careers supporting AYA health.

LEAH fellows will complete a minimum of 300 hours of LEAH leadership and didactic training, in addition to LEAH fieldwork and exposure to interdisciplinary clinical training clinics. LEAH leadership and didactic training will include core courses, conferences, and clinical training seminars. Specific LEAH program components include a Community Collaboration program, Rural Health AYA program, MCHB Title V experience, and AYA/Family Collaboration program. LEAH Fellows must also successfully complete discipline-specific requirements for degree programs, if appropriate.

Candidates must have received their PhD or PsyD in a field of psychology by the start date. Salary is commensurate with NIH level 0 trainee guidelines, and benefits are competitive.
