
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Build e-Consult in EPIC for dermatology Create ongoing CME/MOC opportunities Obtain sustainable financial support Expand e-Consults, scale and review

Accomplishments

- "eConsult to Dermatology" fully functional within EPIC, IS project closed
- 375+consults completed with average of 27 hours turnaround time
- Digital Education Modules approved by CME and being developed/launched
 - Secured funding through Reaching for Health Equity program for 0.1 FTE coverage of continuing dermatology attending time
- Met with key stakeholders within CHOP Finance to strategize outreach to payors
 - Defining value-based benefits of telederm
- Expanded to 2 primary care sites now: Karabots since March 2020 and South Philly since Jan 2021
- Unexpected, successful Rapid upscale and deployment to urgent PCP consults via TryChop, Inpatient and ED temporary deployment during pandemic restrictions starting March 18th, 2020
- Trained all dermatology faculty in use of the eConsult function





Lessons Learned

- Highly useful, valuable service especially in context of COVID-19 pandemic
- Differences in best practices of use by setting
- Digital Divide, this modality may provide greater access than to direct to patient telemedicine
- Case Complexity higher from Karabots PCPs than routine consults
- Digital CME modules through CHOP = uncharted territory
