Trivia is a fun way to engage while educating. Realizing this, the Vaccine Education Center at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (VEC) created *Vaccine Trivia: Just the Vax*, a game that features more than 200 vaccine- and science-themed trivia questions.

More recently, the VEC created a toolkit that can help educators easily use the game and content in the classroom.

- Enhance classroom, bulletin board or assessment materials
- Present vaccine and science information to students in a fun manner

Formats for use

- **Flashcards**
Notecard-sized flashcards can be printed four per page to view multiple choice questions on the front and answers with supplementary info on the back.
- **Question sets**
Single-sheet PDF files each include 10 multiple-choice questions on the front with answers and additional information on the back. Versions without answers are also available.
- **Online game**
Play randomized, 10-question rounds in one of four categories on the website.
- **Content**
Browse more than 200 vaccine- and science-related trivia questions for other uses.

Ways to use the trivia toolkit content

- Set up a gameshow or competition during class or as part of a special event (e.g. club activities, academic bowl).
- Keep question sets or flashcards in the classroom as a free-time activity, extra-credit opportunity, or for use when a substitute is covering.
- Place cards or question sets on students' seats or lab benches before class and begin instruction with a trivia challenge.
- Post links to files or use material as content for class or department webpages, newsletters or social media accounts.
- Use individual questions to engage students at the start of a related unit or add to quizzes.
- Make a bulletin board displaying different questions or flashcards.
- Bookmark or designate the game as a favorite on classroom computers or tablets.
